Sir Richard Burton is undoubtedly one of the most fascinating and most enigmatic figures of the nineteenth century. This expedition, sponsored by the Royal Geographical Society, left Bagamoyo on the Tanzania coast in June 1857. Burton and John Hanning Speke travelled west to Kaze, now Tabora, and then to the Malagarasi River and Lake Tanganyika. Burton fell ill and rested at Kaze while Speke travelled north to Lake Victoria, which he believed to be the source of the White Nile. \$3,000
