

We have been on the hunt for books, from the dusty frontiers of Southern Africa to the shadowy interior of the human mind, to see you through the second half of winter.

A noteworthy collection of works exploring the world of pre-independence Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe) from the two publishers, 'Pioneer Head' and 'Books of Rhodesia' will be perfect for the historians. A travel guide, 'From the Cape to Bulawayo or How to get to Rhodesia through British Territory by one who has done it' (item 237); a four volume set of 'African Hunting' (item 1) and the exploration of Thomas Baine to 'The Victoria Falls Zambesi Rivers; Sketched on the Spot' (item 19) are just a few examples from this detailed and layered suite of works.

Discover the world of mythology and folklore through the eyes of James George Frazer, the prominent Scottish folklorist influential in early mythology and comparative religion. Two examples of the unique areas he explores include 'The Belief in Immortality and the Worship of the Dead' (item 97) which deals directly with the Aborigines of Australia whilst 'The Devil's Advocate. A Plea for Superstition' (item 101) is concerned with myth, magic and religion in Greek culture. The definitive collection of his towering, if somewhat controversial works, 'The Golden Bough' (item 98), make for an interesting and enlightening read.

Our front cover explores the microcosm of what lies within. The poetically exotic world of 'Lotus Land in Japan' by H.G. Ponting (item 226); Anthony Burgess's unsettling fable 'The Ring and the Worm' (item 43); Isaac Asimov's journey into the unknown in 'The Foundation Trilogy' (item 6) and Willis Mac Nicol's history of the art of fortune telling in 'The Cup of Knowledge. A Key to the Mysteries of Divination' (item 200) tell a story of journeys across continent, belief systems and imagined futures.

The book was pulled from the market shortly after its publication because of a libel lawsuit, making the first edition copies very rare.
