In 1937, publisher Tériade launched an art magazine titled Verve which focused on bringing the ideas and techniques of French modern art to a new generation of painters and intellectuals. Explore the art of George Braques with 'The Intimate Sketchbooks of G. Braque' (item 33), Pablo Picasso's 'Picasso a Vaullauris, 1949-1951' (item 224) and the works of artists such as Man Ray and Henry Cartier-Bresson in an early volume of 'Verve: An Artistic and Literary Quarterly' (item 294).

Gain a unique and firsthand perspective on the lesser-known characters, places and events that have contributed to Australian history with our parliamentary papers. Issues covered include the banning of blackbirding in Queensland (item 25), the role of convict John Tawell in the 1861 resignation of New South Wales Premier Charles Cowper's ministry (item 276) and France's role in New Hebrides in 1886 (item 202)

Readers passionate about the Asian or Arab world will be satiated. Look into the mind of Mao Tsu-Tung, the founder of the People's Republic of China in the 'Selected Works of Mao Tse-Tung' (item 287). Travel through Arabia with Haji Williamson, English adventurer and early convert to Islam in 'Arabian Adventurer: The Story of Haji Williamson' (item 124). See the world of the occult and witchery through the eyes of one of Australia's most unique and controversial artists in 'Rosaleen Norton: Kings Cross Witch' (item 207).

The books gracing our cover celebrate the joys of childhood with 'The Four Pooh Books' by A.A. Milne (item 185), the colour and diversity of 'The Butterflies of Europe' by Henry C. Lang (item 151), the artistic celebration of Indigenous heritage by Emily Kngwarreye in 'Alhalkere: Paintings From Utopia' (item 145) and the lyrical prose of French poet Charles Baudelaire in 'Baudelaire: Fleurs Du Mal in Pattern in Prose' (item 85).
