A witness to the early days and establishment of the colony of Sydney Cove, John Drummond's life was one of adventure and venturing into the unknown. Whether it was taking on the role of quartermaster on H.M.S. Sirius in the First Fleet or surviving a wreck on Norfolk Island in 1790, he is an important figure in Australia's colonial history. See where it all started with his Naval Commission from 1784 (item 84). Signed by King George the Third and senior officials of the Royal Marine, this is a unique and rare piece of Australian history.

Books that have been signed by authors can be an interesting addition to any collection or make for a distinctive gift.
